The Pathway to Prosperity Endowment Campaign and the Marjorie Marugg-Wolfe Sustainability Campaign were developed to maintain the longevity of our organization. With the merging of SPSFNWA (serving Carroll, Madison, and Washington County) and SPSF Benton County in July 2021, the corpus of the endowment has increased and so has the return on our total investments.

This success places SPSFNWA in a position to preserve a lifelong endowment that will benefit many generations to come. For the third year in a row, SPSFNWA was certified platinum transparency, an accomplishment that only 17% of the nation's non-profits hold.

ENCOURAGEMENT GROUP

In January, the counseling department launched a new program called The Encouragement Group as a way to facilitate connections between current recipients and alumni. The group of around 13 meets the first Monday of each month for dinner (provided by alumni) and to work through the Rising alumni) and to work through the Rising Strong[™] curriculum that was developed by Dr. Brene' Brown. As one of the few Certified Daring Way[™] facilitators in the state, our counseling director, Twyla, is guiding the group through this well-researched approach to "rising strong after a fall" and encouraging participants to challenge each other to continue to reshape how their families continue to reshape how their families connect and build healthy patterns.
