We are approaching our second year as a merged organization, and I am proud to report the state of the union at SPSFNWA is strong. With shared resources among the former two entities, we are serving more single-parent families than ever and offering essential services that make a difference in the day-to-day lives of our recipients. With a dedicated staff and board, the future is brighter than ever.

As many of you know, SPSFNWA alumnus Twyla Rownak, MS, LPC, LMFT leads our Counseling Services department. In the last two years, she has supervised three master-level counseling interns, which has expanded our capacity to see more clients. These services are available free of charge to anyone enrolled in our program and their families. The behavioral healthcare system is overwhelmed, and our recipients and families oftentimes fall through the cracks. Twyla and her team are indispensable resources to SPSFNWA's mission.

The Scholarship/Program team, Carrie, Katlyn, and Gina work tirelessly to ensure our recipients and families have the best resources possible for success. Each member of the team holds a workforce and career counseling credential. This is pivotal for career coaching and advising as the recipient completes their degree.

Another frequently accessed resource is our non-food pantry, where families can pick up free costly household items with high household budget implications. We rely on volunteers and our vendor community to supply the pantry and defray some of the cost. Our most needed items are laundry detergent, paper towels, toilet paper, dryer sheets, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, dish soap, and feminine hygiene products.



These are just a few program offerings beyond the "scholarship check" awarded each semester. Our philosophy follows the quote above from Roy T. Bennett, shift your energy to what you can create. This sentiment follows our mission statement, "Changing Lives by Encouraging Personal Success Through Higher Education."
