## SPARK OF L PARF FUND

The Spark of Hope event was an incredible success, bringing together over 450 attendees in support of single parents pursuing higher education. Thanks to the generosity of individual donors, who contributed \$35,480, and the backing of our sponsors, who donated \$85,700, we raised an impressive \$121,180. Additionally, with \$35,500 in in-kind sponsorships, the event's gross total reached \$156,680.

We began the evening with a special VIP reception honoring our founders, Marjorie Marugg-Wolfe and Ralph Nesson, who co-founded this organization 40 uears ago. The reception was a heartfelt tribute, gathering friends and family from both the Marugg Wolfe and Nesson families to celebrate the enduring legacy they created together.



### **BACK TO SCHOOL**

On August 1st, we celebrated back-to-school with our fall recipients and their kids with a drive thru pickup. 251 brand-new backpacks filled with the essentials were given out, and parents got a scholarship of \$100 per child to help pay for clothes, shoes, and other needs. A total of \$31,000 was awarded to 310 children. This Fall Semester we have 161 Degree Program recipients, 14 Credentialing and Workforce Development Program recipients, and 11 GAP Program recipients.
